FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 4:8-12

Gospel: John 10:11-18

Deacon's Corner

The Feast of St. Mark, Evangelist

During this fourth week of Easter, the feast of St. Mark, Evangelist is celebrated on Thursday, April 25. St. Mark was the son of Mary, who owned "the upper room," which served as the meeting place for the first Christians in Jerusalem (Acts 12:12). St. Mark is the author of one of the four Gospels and was a missionary in the early Church. He helped St. Paul and St. Barnabas in preaching the Gospel throughout Cyprus and the surrounding region.

In the Gospel according to St. Mark, he describes Jesus's life in a concise and vivid way. This Gospel is the shortest of all the Gospels containing 16 chapters and was written to help in the conversion of the Gentiles. In the first verse of this Gospel, Jesus is proclaimed as "the Son of God." There is evidence that St. Mark's Gospel was the first Gospel written around 60 A.D.

Later in life, according to tradition, St. Mark was ordained a bishop and sent to Alexandria, Egypt to preach the Good News. After twenty years of ministering to the people, he was martyred. St. Mark is the patron saint of attorneys, captives, and notaries. During this week, read and meditate on a verse or chapter in St. Mark's Gospel and ask Jesus to help you understand how it applies to your daily life. Like St. Mark, let us proclaim the Good News through our examples as we love Our Lord and our neighbors.
