

THE SHROUD OF TURIN:

Dr. Edward Krzykwa will speak about the Shroud of Turin in Mother Cabrini Church Hall on Wednesday, May 14th at both 1PM and 6PM. The Shroud of Turin is believed by many to have been the linen cloth used to wrap the body of Jesus for burial. Dr. Krzykwa, a chiropractic doctor

May 4, 2025 Third Sunday of Easter

First Reading: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

The high priest chastised Peter and the other apostles for continuing to preach when they had been ordered to stop. Peter replied he would rather obey God than men, considering God's power even over death. They are again warned to stop speaking of Jesus, and then freed.

Second Reading: Revelation 5:11-14

John had a vision of many angels and all the living creatures of the world gathered around a throne. The angels cried out that the slain Lamb was worthy of receiving power, glory and praise. Then every creature on earth called out praise to God and the Lamb, and the elders fell down and worshipped.

Deacon's Corner Third Sunday of Easter

On the Third Sunday of Easter, in the Gospel of St. John, Jesus speaks His disciples after His Resurrection. Jesus reveals Himself again to them at the Sea of Tiberias. He says to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me . . .?" Simon Peter answers Him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus says to him, "Feed my lambs." In this command, Our Lord invites Peter and the other disciples to leave their former way of life and embrace a life of loving God and one's neighbors.

Like Peter, we too are called to provide for "God's lambs" by our time, talent, and treasure to fully participate in God's plan for our lives. Are we coming forward and saying yes to Our Lord in seeing His presence in one another? Is Our Lord asking you to serve someone in need or to trust Him in a new way? Is God asking you to serve in a parish ministry? This love of our sisters and brothers may be through small daily acts or in decisions about our spiritual life.

This week, may we pray about where and how Jesus is calling each one of us to serve. "Lord, my God, show me where You want me to serve. Help me to be open to Your call and to discern Your path for me. May my heart be filled with love and a desire to follow Your will. Amen."
