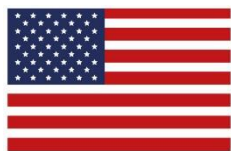
**"In Christ Jesus you who once were far off have become near by the blood of Christ... When he had disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd and he began to teach them many things."**

**SIXTEENTH SUNDAY

**First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6**

In this passage, God denounces false leaders who have scattered his people. He promises that they will be reunited and led by one who is just and wise.

**Second Reading: Ephesians 2:13-18**

Paul explains that through Jesus Christ, there is no longer hostility between Gentile and Jew. Instead, through the Spirit of Christ, both groups become one body and are equal in the eyes of God.

**Gospel: Mark 6:30-34**

The apostles returned after their first mission and told Jesus what they had done and taught. He told them to rest, but the people kept coming to them. So they went to find a private place, but the people learned where they were going and arrived first. Jesus felt sorry for them and decided to teach them instead of resting.

**DEACON'S CORNER**

**Saints Anne and Joachim**

On Friday, July 26, the feast day of Saints Anne and Joachim, the parents of the Blessed Mother and the earthly grandparents of Jesus, will be celebrated. With little information about their lives, it is accepted that Saints Anne and Joachim were faithful and devoted parents. Their love for one another and Mary is an example to us of how God calls us to live. Their legacy shows us the importance of grandparents in forming a loving family and enhancing the faith of families.

Grandparents play an essential role in sharing their wisdom and family history. Pope Francis explains, "How important grandparents are for family life, for passing on the human and religious heritage . . . How important it is to have intergenerational exchanges and dialogue, especially within the context of the family. Children and the elderly build the future of peoples: children because they lead history forward, the elderly because they transmit the experience and wisdom of their lives. This relationship and dialogue are a treasure to be preserved and strengthened (Aparecida Document, No. 447)."

Saint Anne is the patron of grandparents, couples without children, and women unable to conceive. Saint Joachim is the patron of grandfathers, fathers, and grandparents. On this day, may we pray, "Saints Anne and Joachim, guide our hearts in the way of virtue. Help us to parent our children and grandchildren with a gentle heart as you did. Show us how to raise our children in faith and bring our families into the Light of Jesus."
