## Deacon's Corner

The feast of Saint Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr, will be celebrated on Wednesday, August 10. St. Lawrence was one of seven deacons of the Church of Rome in the second century. His diaconate ministry was one of service to God and to the people. He gave help to the poor, the sick and the needy. Church tradition explains that the Prefect of Rome at that time was a greedy official who thought the Church had a great fortune hidden away. He ordered Lawrence to bring the Church's treasure to him. The Saint said he would in three days. St. Lawrence went around Rome and gathered all the poor and sick people supported by the Church and told the Prefect "This is the Church's treasure." In anger, the official condemned Lawrence to a cruel death. Before his death, he prayed that the city of Rome might be converted to Jesus and that the Christian faith might spread over the world. St. Lawrence is the patron saint of the poor and deacons. May we ask St. Lawrence to pray for us that we always open our hearts to those in need.
