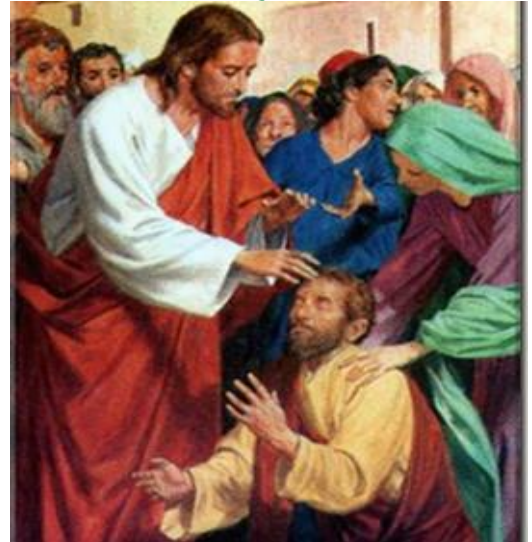

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses explains to the people that a prophet will come from among them, and that they should listen to this prophet's words, for God has told him of this prophet. God also tells Moses that anyone who pretends to speak in his words, or speaks in the name of other gods shall die.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

Paul tells the Corinthians how an unmarried man or woman is able to devote themselves fully to God without concern for the needs of a spouse. Paul explains that God wants to help them promote good and devote themselves more fully to God.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

As Jesus was teaching, a man with an unclean spirit came to the synagogue and asked if Jesus had come to destroy them. Jesus ordered the spirit out of the man, who shrieked violently as the spirit departed. The people were amazed at the authority he had over the spirit.

Deacon's Corner

St. John Bosco, Priest

The Memorial for St. John Bosco will be celebrated on Wednesday, January 31. St. John was born in Becchi, Italy, in 1815. He was ordained a priest and in 1869 established the Society of St. Francis de Sales, also known as the **Salesians**. This order, which exists today, does charitable work with children around the world. St. John began a ministry for **poor boys and orphans** to teach them a **trade** during the day and to give them instructions in the faith during the **evening**.

Every day he would **spend time with** these young men in his school and would hear **confessions** before breakfast. One day in 1848, St John was celebrating **Mass** in honor of the Feast of the Annunciation. The small church was filled with **360 young men**. When the time came for **Holy Communion**, he went to the tabernacle to remove the hosts. To his **surprise**, he discovered that **only eight hosts** were reserved there. Many people were present, including Giuseppe Buzzetti, who would later become one of the first Salesian priests and who was the **altar server** during that Mass. He wondered what would happen.

The saint **removed** the eight hosts from the tabernacle and began **distributing** Holy Communion. The young Giuseppe followed the priest with the **paten**. He was amazed to watch as the ciborium miraculously **fill up with hosts** which allowed **everyone** to receive Holy Communion. God sends miracles like these occasionally to remind and assure each one of us that **nothing is impossible** for God.
