




When weekend blustery winter conditions (i.e. snow, sleet, icy conditions etc.) prevent your safe travel to Mass, please remember to bring and add your offertory

Deacon's Corner


The Memorial of St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, will be celebrated on Wednesday, January 24. St. Francis was born into a noble family near the city of Geneva, Switzerland in 1567. Since childhood, he knew that he wanted to serve God by becoming a priest, but kept it silent from his family. His father wanted him to enter a career in law and politics.

St. Francis attended the University of Paris and then received a doctorate of law from the University of Padua. He continued to study theology and never lost the desire to become a priest. One day, as he was riding his horse, he fell three times from the horse. Each time, the sword from his scabbard fell out and formed the shape of a cross. After discussions with his father, he was ordained a priest and eventually became the bishop of Geneva.

During this time, through his personal visits to homes and villages, Francis brought back 40,000 Calvinists to the Catholic Church. St. Francis wrote the book, "Introduction to the Devout Life" which he created for the laity. He believed "the key to love of God was prayer." He said, "By turning your eyes on God, your whole soul will be filled with God." The test of prayers was a person's actions. "To be an angel in prayer and a beast in one's relations with people is to go lame on both legs."

May we imitate St. Francis' gentle nature and his daily desire to serve God and His people.
