Deacon's Corner

We will celebrate the "Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, the Apostle," on Tuesday, January 25th. St. Paul, named Saul, was born to the tribe of Benjamin in Tarsus (present day Turkey) and was a Roman citizen. One day, he was enroute to Damascus to arrest and bring Christians back to Jerusalem. During this journey, he was blinded by a light from heaven. In this light, Paul saw the glorified body of Jesus who spoke to him. Jesus asked, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" Paul replied, "Who are you, sir?" Christ responded, "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9: 4-5). Through this appearance of Our Lord, St. Paul converted and became a faithful disciple of Jesus. Jesus chose St. Paul to spread the Good News to people around the world. St. Paul was baptized, began preaching to the Gentiles, and founded many local churches. He made three major missionary trips to Asia Minor and southern Europe in which many people converted to Christianity. He wrote thirteen Epistles, which are found in the New Testament. These epistles are some of the earliest records of the life and history of the early Church. St. Paul is the patron saint of missions, writers and publishers. May we pray, "St. Paul, pray for us in responding with faith to love Jesus more fully, to know Him more deeply, and to spread His Gospel to all.
