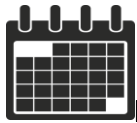

Deacon's Corner

On Tuesday, October 17, we celebrate the memorial of Saint Ignatius of Antioch, Bishop and Martyr. He is one of the three Apostolic Fathers who had direct ties to the Apostles. One of the earliest faith communities that was established in the Roman Empire by the Apostles was in the city of Antioch. St. Ignatius became the third bishop of Antioch, serving in this role for forty years.

During the second persecution of Christians by the Roman Empire (81 to 96 A.D.), Bishop Ignatius kept the faithful in Antioch safe from this persecution through his constant prayers and penances. Around the year 107 A.D., the Emperor Trajan met St. Ignatius and ordered him to offer sacrifices to the Roman gods. He refused and professed his faith to Jesus Christ.

Ignatius was bound in chains and taken to Rome to be martyred. During this long journey to Rome, along the way, he encouraged the people not to accept the various heresies. He also wrote a number of letters in which he professed his devotion to Jesus and his belief in Christ's divinity and Resurrection. In one letter, he explained, "I am God's wheat, and I am to be ground by the teeth of wild beasts, so that I may become the pure bread of Christ." He was martyred by the lions in the Flavian Amphitheater.

On his feast day, may we pray, "St. Ignatius, help and pray for us to live our lives by your example of faith and courage."
