## Deacon's Corner

The solemnity of the Saints or "All Saints Day" will be celebrated on Wednesday, November 1, a holy day of obligation. In 609 A.D., All Saints Day was instituted by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs.

On this day, we venerate the holy women and men who have been canonized by the Holy Church. Saints are "persons who, after having lived a life of virtue, die in the state of grace and have been granted the reward of eternal life with God. The saints enjoyed the beatific vision and unceasingly interceded for us still in earthly life." They serve as our models and inspiration for our spiritual growth in daily life.

On this holy day, may we pray, "O Lord, give us the protection of the saints. Grant us their assistance in overcoming temptation and gaining the fullness of life with You. Amen."
